Carver County Sheriff Jim Olson reports that on April 17, 2018, at about 1:53AM, deputies responded to a report of a burglary in progress on Prosperity Lane in Waconia, MN. Deputies arrived and observed obvious signs of forced entry, which included footprint impressions on the door.

The occupants of the residence told the deputies an unknown man, driving a black Chevy Cobalt, had been following one of the victims who had recently left the residence. The suspect was driving aggressively by tailgating, flashing headlights, and disobeying stop signs. The victim returned to the residence, entered the open garage, and was confronted by the male. The victim went into the home and closed the entrance door to the garage with the help of the two other victims in the residence. The male began kicking the door and attempted to use an ice auger to pry it open. The victims tried to barricade the door to keep it shut. The suspect fled the residence when he learned law enforcement had been called.

Sheriff's deputies in a neighboring community observed a black Chevy Cobalt traveling eastbound on MN 5 at speeds nearing 100 mph. Deputies pursued the vehicle eastbound on MN 5, onto US 212, then eastbound on I-494. Edina Police Department used spike strips to deflate two of the suspect's tires. He continued east on I-494, still travelling about 70 MPH, before turning north on MN 77, then east on MN 62, and eventually exited onto a service road adjacent to MN 62. Bloomington Police Department used a pursuit intervention technique to terminate the chase. The suspect immediately placed his hands in the air and was arrested without further incident.

The suspect, Robert Paul Andrejzchick (26) of Cologne, admitted to attempting to enter the residence on Prosperity Lane and fleeing when he learned law enforcement was responding. Andrejzchick thought an old girlfriend may have been at the residence.

Andrejzchick is in the Carver County Jail pending formal charges of burglary and fleeing police in a motor vehicle.
