Supplies and instructions for each activity are provided at the campground lobby/office. This program will run from 10:00am – 11:00am.

This program is **FREE** however; visitors from the public must have a valid Park Pass (Annual or Daily Pass)

May:

25th – Nature Crowns - Use the beauty of nature to create a colorful crown with natural materials

June:

1st – Fish prints - Create an artistic, painted picture of fish – a Japanese art form

8th – Photo Match - Find the same scenes in the park using photos taken in the winter

15th – Story Walk® Ten Pigs by Derek Anderson with Carver County Libraries - Follow the story as it leads you on an adventure in the park

22nd – Nature Journals - Create your own special journal to take on self-guided hikes

29th – Pop Can Casting -Build a functioning fishing reel using a pop can and then test it out on Eagle Lake

July:

6th– Bottle O’ Fish - A twist and a turn can transform an ordinary water bottle into a marvelous masterpiece

13th – Story Walk® Three Billy Goat’s Gruff by Paul Galdone with Carver County Libraries - Follow the story as it leads you on an adventure through the park

20th – Story Walk® Frank Henry & the Zoo Band by Paul Kamish- Follow the story as it leads you on an adventure through the park

27th – Foliage Prints - Press painted leaves onto paper to make interesting and colorful stamped designs

August:

3rd – Pet Rocks - Turn ordinary rocks into furry friends using a variety of materials

10th – Story Walk® I Went Walking by Sue Williams with Carver County Libraries - Follow the story as it leads you through the park

17th – Sand Art - Sand, seashells and glue. All of the materials you will need to create a masterpiece

24th – Leaf Mosaic- Turn nature into art! Create a picture of your favorite animal using leaves and glue

31st – Pond Study – Discover new and strange things about the water and its inhabitants
