Carver County Sheriff Jason Kamerud reports that on November 3, 2019 at 7:54AM his Office received a 9-1-1 call of a hunting accident. David Hoese, a 61-year-old resident of Winsted Township, McLeod County was wounded during the morning of Sunday, November 3, 2019, when he was struck by BBs/shot fired from a shotgun while duck hunting in Hollwood Township, Carver County.

The hunting partner was moving his boat into position behind Hoese's boat in the weeds. Shortly after, he sat his shotgun down to secure his boat, the gun went off. It was also noted that the hunting partner's dog was in the boat. Hoese was hit in the chest and face in his own boat approximately 10-15 feet away.

Carver County Sheriff's Office and Ridgeview Medical Center ambulance responded to the scene. Hoese was taken by Ridgeview paramedics via ambulance to Hennepin Health Care with non-life-threatening injuries. The Carver County Sheriff's Office is continuing its investigation in this case.
