

## Addressing Homelessness

The Scott-Carver Housing Coalition was formed in 1990 to address the issues of homelessness in Scott County and Carver County. In 2010, the Coalition formed the Heading Home Scott-Carver work group to develop a 10-year Plan to End Homelessness. This plan has five broad goals:

- 1 Prevent Homelessness
- 1 Increase Housing Opportunities
- 1 Increase Outreach
- 1 Increase Service Delivery
- 1 Increase Community Awareness and Involvement in Ending Homelessness

In 2015, members of the Housing Coalition adopted a Coordinated Entry System to increase outreach and improve service delivery to those who are homeless. This system uses Housing Assessments to match the needs of the homeless with resources in the community. Data gathered through this process helps raise community awareness and involvement in ending homelessness. This leads to support for increased housing opportunities.

# Housing Assessment

If you are experiencing homelessness, you may be eligible for a Housing Assessment.

This assessment determines if you are eligible to be put on the Central Homeless Program Priority List. All local programs that offer housing for homeless individuals and families are filled from people on this list.
